I'm passionate about the opportunity to help people meet their financial goals, and I believe my extensive experience as a professional financial communicator would translate well to a role in financial advice/planning. I've been working in financial marketing/editorial roles for nine years, and a short stint before that in public relations.

I've joined the local chapter of the Financial Planning Association, for which I've done volunteer phone outreach to drive attendance to events. I'm also putting the finishing touches on a personal finance blog I plan to launch in a few weeks. I currently hold my Series 6 and 63 licenses.

The challenge I am encountering is that I don't have any client-facing experience, and so far the only roles that I've seen are entry-level or sales-only roles that would require a ~50% pay cut, which is just not something I can do with two little ones at home while I'm the sole breadwinner.
